Welcome to the College Area Community Garden

- Established in late 2012 on *privately owned land* adjacent to SDSU, the garden is a not-for-profit association serving the entire College Area of San Diego. We exist so that people of all skill levels can grow organic veggies and be involved in healthier living by consuming natural foods and living more sustainably.
- The Garden is run by an elected “working” board which is ably assisted by Team Leaders who are gardeners.
- Gardeners lease raised boxes in which to grow their choice of non-GMO veggies and flowers for personal use. Gardeners also share equally in the bounty of our common planting areas. We currently have managed planted areas with 58+ fruit trees and various fruiting vines, plus beautiful wildflowers to attract pollinators.
- The Garden offers periodic classes and workshops taught by subject matter experts that cover topics directly related to growing and maintaining vegetables and fruit.

- **Volunteering opportunities** are offered on a regular basis, usually on Saturday's, but we can often accommodate requests for alternate days. Scheduled volunteering days are announced in advance on our website, www.collegeareagarden.org.

- **Typical volunteer projects include:** distributing mulch, hand weeding non-native and invasive weeds, clearing fallen tree branches, picking up loose materials and debris, help with composting, amending soil in veggie boxes, hand watering and related tasks.



- Over 1,800 individuals have helped us since we started. We are so very grateful for all the support.
