

Prescription Assistance

I can't afford the prescription my provider gave me, what can I do?

There are a few options that can assist you in paying for certain prescribed medications.

Together Rx Access

This is a free program that helps qualified individuals without prescription drug coverage save approximately 25%-40% or more on over 275 brand-name prescription drugs and other prescription products, as well as generic drugs. To qualify you must meet all of the following criteria:

- Not eligible for Medicare
- No prescription coverage (public or private)
- Household income equal to or less than:

\$30,000 for a single person

\$40,000 for a family of two

\$50,000 for a family of three

\$60,000 for a family of four

\$70,000 for a family of five

Patient Assistance Programs

Patient Assistance Programs provide no cost prescription medications to eligible participants. Many drug companies give away free prescription medications to people who have no insurance and qualify for their programs.
