# **Know APIDA History!**

## **APIDA Center defines AANAPISI!**

The Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institution (AANAPISI) program was established by U.S. Congress in 2007. Its purpose was to support college campuses in their efforts to enhance the accessibility and quality of higher education for Asian Pacific Islander Desi American (APIDA) college students. AANAPISIs promotes APIDA student academic success through innovative and culturally-relevant academic and student support services, co-curricular programming, research, and scholarship.

Although AANAPISIs make up only 6.1% of all U.S. colleges and universities, they enroll nearly half of the country's APIDA undergraduate students. AANAPISIs confer almost 50% of associate degrees and 30% of baccalaureate degrees attained by APIDA students in the United States. Since the program's establishment, AANAPISIs have improved retention and degree attainment for underserved communities, especially first-generation students and students from low-income backgrounds.

The number of AANAPISIs continues to grow. According to a report by the Asian Pacific Islander American (APIA) Scholars, there are almost over 200 colleges and universities that qualify as AANAPISIs. (To qualify, institutions must have an undergraduate enrollment of at least 10% APIDA and 50% of degree students must receive needs-based financial assistance.) Despite the growing number of AANAPISIs, only a fraction have received funding through the program.

In the California State University system, only 14 of the 23 campuses are AANAPISI-eligible. In 2021, SDSU intentionally sought and received federal recognition as an AANAPISI. Since then, we have continued to advance our AANAPISI efforts at SDSU. Today, in 2024, we finally have an Office of AANAPISI! YAY!
