

APIDA Center hosts Hawaiian History Month!

The <u>Hawaii Pono'î Coalition</u> was founded in 2007 to educate those who live in and visit Hawai'i about its true history - a long history that predates U.S. colonialism. In October 2019, under the support of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs (AHCC), the Coalition submitted a resolution to establish September as Hawaiian History Month. Although the hearing of the resolution was postponed due to Covid-19, the Hawai'i Pono'î Coalition launched Hawaiian History Month virtually in on September 2, 2020 in honor of <u>Queen Lili'uokalani</u>'s (1838-1917) 182nd birthday. This inaugural celebration was held virtually from Iolani Palace, which was formerly the royal residence of the Hawaiian monarchy.

Since its launch, Hawaiian History Month continues to be a time of celebration, education, and activism. It is a time to celebrate the legacies of the Hawaiian people and to educate and preserve native Hawaiian history and culture. Community partners and allies across the United States are working to amplify and preserve native Hawaiian culture.

This is the second year that the SDSU APIDA Center has celebrated Hawaiian History Month. Join us!


The <u>Center for Inclusive Excellence</u> received the <u>Presidential Staff</u>
