#### From Dr. Loh-Hagan: Fall into Fall!

SDSU was closed this past Monday, September 2nd for Labor Day. Labor Day is a U.S. federal holiday that honors and recognizes the American labor movement and laborers. Much of this country's wealth and wellbeing is attributed to the labor of BIPOC communities. More specifically, APIDA communities have labored in agriculture, railroads, tech, laundries, garment factories, nail salons, restaurants, and more. Having faced a history of legalized exclusion (i.e., immigration barriers, restrictions from owning land, bans on citizenship, etc.), APIDA activists have resisted and united in order to have their labor and humanity recognized.

In addition, for many of us, Labor Day signifies the end of summer and the official start of the school season. ### **APIDA Center learns about APALA!**

In 1990, APIDA labor activists approached the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations (AFL-CIO), a national trade union. They proposed the formation of a national APIDA labor group. Founded in 1992, the Asian Pacific American Labor Alliance (APALA) is the first and only national organization of APIDA workers. Most are union members seeking to advance the rights of workers, immigrants, and BIPOC communities. APALA has more than 22 chapters and a national office in Washington, D.C. APALA plays a distinct role as the central link between organized labor and the APIDA community.

San Diego has an APALA chapter. In 2022, The UCLA Labor Center and SD APALA chapter hosted a powerful convening to fight for immigrant and migrant worker justice in San Diego and Tijuana. Events were held on both sides of the border. APIDA undocumented youth organizers, immigration policy experts, and immigrant advocates led discussions about how to mobilize to support farm worker union organizing, permanent protections for DACA recipients, and pathways to citizenship. In Tijuana, participants joined local activists for a silent march at Friendship Park and then observed a border church mass. They also visited a migrant worker training center and migrant crisis center.
