# **Know APIDA History!**







### APIDA Center learns about San Diego's "Koreatown"!

The first major wave of Korean immigrants to the United States started in the early 1900s. Over 7,000 Koreans were recruited to work on Hawaiian sugar plantations. When their contracts ended, many Korean laborers moved to California and established businesses. As a result of the Korean War (1950-1953), a second wave of immigrants consisting of war brides (i.e., Korean wives of American soldiers), war orphans adopted by American families, and professionals arrived. A third major wave of Korean immigrants populated California and other parts of the United States as a result of the Immigration Act of 1965, which revoked a national quota system and enabled family reunification. Since then, Korean ethnic enclaves have developed across the nation in cities such as San Francisco, Los Angeles, and San Diego.

Many Korean immigrants in San Diego established businesses in what is now known as the Convoy Asian Cultural District, becoming a hub for San Diego's mini-Koreatown. Zion Marketplace, a Korean-based supermarket, opened in the Convoy District in 1979 and became the first Korean grocery store in San Diego. In 1996, Geunyoung Jin and Kyungmi Jin, who both immigrated to California in the 1950s, opened Jin Music Studios, which is now the oldest karaoke establishment in San Diego. As the APIDA diaspora grew in San Diego, the Convoy District further developed and became a Pan-Asian community of businesses and organizations.

Today, businesses owned by Korean Americans are growing and thriving on Convoy Street, further developing San Diego's mini-Koreatown. Along with many other APIDA-owned businesses, Korean American-owned businesses such as Korean barbecue joints and karaoke studios continue to serve as hubs for family and community gatherings.

### **APIDA Center has been busy!**


