## **APIDA Center learns about CAPIAA!**

This week, Dr. Loh-Hagan attended the inaugural CA AAPI Policy Summit hosted by the California Commission on Asian and Pacific Islander American Affairs (CAPIAA) and by Sacramento State University.

CAPIAA was established in 2002 and is charged with elevating the political, economic, and social issues of APIDA communities in California. CAPIAA advises the Governor and the Legislature and works with policymakers, state agencies, departments, and commissions to develop appropriate responses and programs that meet the needs of APIDA communities across the state. CAPIAA helps to shape public policy on pressing issues. For example, they were integral to securing \$8M to serve AANAPISIs in the CSU system. (SDSU has benefitted from this initiative!)

Currently, at least three of the Commissioners are from San Diego: Jason Paguio (Chair), **Kirin Macapugay** (Vice Chair and SDSU alumna), and Darshana Patel.
