From Dr. Loh-Hagan: AANAPISI Week!

AANAPISI Week (September 23–September 29, 2024) celebrates the Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institutions (AANAPISI) designation, which was established by Congress on September 27, 2007, to improve the availability and quality of postsecondary education programs to support low-income, first-generation Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) students.

This September 2024, we had announced the establishment of SDSU's Office for AANAPISI Affairs and I am thrilled to serve as the inaugural Executive Director. As this Office is among the first of its kind, SDSU is positioned as a model of serving-ness for APIDA excellence. We are a proud AANAPISI!!!!!

Here are some comments from our <u>students</u>:

- "Being an AANAPISI that intentionally serves APIDA students is important for addressing disparities in education and providing equitable access to various resources in order to ensure student success."
- "Being an AANAPISI is important because it creates a sense of belonging and safety, which is essential for student success. Students who feel represented and valued can better access resources and communicate with professors. Visible APIDA role models instill confidence."

APIDA Center learns about FANHS San Diego!

The Filipino American National Historical Society (FANHS) was founded in Seattle, Washington by Dr. Dorothy Laigo Cordova (born 1932) and her husband, Fred, in 1982. (Super Fun Fact: In April 2024, the APIDA Center took students to Seattle and we actually met Dr. Cordova and visited the FANHS headquarters!)

FANHS became a non-profit organization in 1985 under the Cordovas' leadership. FANHS's mission is "to promote understanding, education, enlightenment, appreciation, and enrichment through the identification, gathering, preservation, and dissemination of the history and culture of Filipino Americans in the United States."

In 1992, FANHS began celebrating Filipinx American History Month (FAHM) in October to commemorate the first Filipinx people who arrived in Morro Bay, California and the birthday of Fil-Am labor leader, Larry Itliong (1913-1977). The Cordovas established a FANHS National Museum in Stockton, California and 40+ chapters across the United States.

FANHS San Diego was established on September 23rd, 1995. Since its establishment, FAHNS San Diego has implemented several initiatives that amplify and preserve Fil-Am history in San Diego. For example, in collaboration with PASACAT Performing Arts Company and the Council of Philippine American Organizations of San Diego (COPAO), FANHS San Diego established the Filipinos of South Bay Exhibit (FoSBE) in the Chula Vista Heritage Museum. This first-of-a-kind exhibit captures the stories of Filipinos and Filipino Americans in San Diego, and is open for viewing until December 2024.

Another Fun Fact: The APIDA Center took students there last FAHM. This year, we will host another field trip to the FoSBE along with other Fil-Am historic sites in San Diego. Stay tuned to our <u>Insta</u> to get on board as there will be limited seats.

APIDA Center learns about Hawaiian Quilting!

On Monday, September 23rd, we hosted a cultural crafting workshop about <u>Hawaiian quilting</u> as part of our National Hawaiian History Month celebration. Initially, quilting was used as a colonizing tool as it was taught by White missionaries; however, Hawaiians reclaimed the art and made it their own.

APIDA Center learns about Queen Lili'uokalani!

On September 26th, the APIDA Center hosted a Cultural Education Program about Queen Lili'uokalani (1838-1917), the last Hawaiian monarch who was overthrown in a coup backed by the U.S. military and led by White businessmen with vested interests in exploiting Hawaii's resources. An activist and artivist, the Queen never stopped fighting for her people's rights and independence. The fight for Hawaiian sovereignty continues today.

On September 26th, the APIDA Center hosted a <u>Student-Led Workshop</u> about <u>Kumihimo</u>, a Japanese braiding art form. This workshop was led by **Nelson Hawkins**, an APIDA Center Intern and third-year business major. Attendees learned about the historical and cultural significance of Kumihimo and made their own <u>braids</u>! (**Momoka Dhanuwidjaja**, a first-year International Business major, even brought her dad to join the fun!)
