Focus on basic needs!

In the upcoming week, I want to highlight two events/initiatives. First, from November 15-19, the SDSU Economic Crisis Response Team (ECRT) is hosting a series of events in observance of Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week. Please plan to attend as many events as possible. These events are designed to help you learn more about basic needs resources. APIDA Center will be participating in the Basic Needs Resource Fair on November 16 from 10-2pm in the Student Union Courtyard. Come visit us! Second, on Monday, November 15 from 10-2pm, APIDA Center in collaboration with Phi Beta Delta Honor Society for International Scholars is hosting a Virtual Fall Symposium about learning from this land. Protecting and respecting our land - which gives us food, shelter, and sustenance - should be a basic, fundamental driving force of our daily living. RSVP here. Come learn from amazing speakers:

- Mai Nguyen (they/them), also known as Farmer Mai, is an independent farm owner-operator who
 grows heirloom crops, as well as a social justice activist. Nguyen is also co-Director at Minnow,
 an organization that secures farmland tenure for California's farmers of color while supporting
 indigenous sovereignty. Her talk is entitled, "Farming As Activism." Farming can be a way of
 fighting climate change, advancing racial justice, and supporting human and bio-diversity if we
 choose.
- Mark Sung Alapaki Luke is an Associate Professor and the Division Chair of Hawaiian Programs
 at Honolulu Community College. His teaching is centered around culture and place-based
 pedagogy. He focuses on native 'ike (knowledge) from the kūpuna (elders) that have given us a
 foundation of 'ike 'āina (learning from the land/earth). His talk is entitled, "Native Knowledge
 Now." Taro has deep roots in Hawaiian genealogy, culture, and land. Luke will address issues of
 community, sustainability, and food security.
- Margo Robbins is the co-founder and executive director of the Cultural Fire Management
 Council. She comes from the traditional Yurok village of Morek. She gathers and prepares
 traditional food and medicine. She is a basket weaver and regalia maker. Her talk is entitled, "Fire
 is Medicine." Indigenous peoples have used fire to maintain a healthy, productive, and balanced
 ecosystem. Such practices have cultural and ecological benefits and helps keep communities
 safer from wildfire. Learn more about Robbins' work in reclaiming fire as a land management tool.
