 They arrived in 1903.
- We have several APIDA student orgs that have over 50 years of experience here at SDSU: <u>VSA</u> was founded in 1968; <u>AB Samahan</u> was founded in 1971; <u>APSA</u> was established in 1972.
- APIDA Center officially opened in July 2020. In 2021, we applied for our first <u>AANAPISI</u> grant.

Scholarships

- The <u>Shui Kuen and Allen Chin Scholarship</u> is a \$1,000 scholarship. Qualified applicants must meet the following criteria and <u>apply by March 25</u>:
 - o Must be a full-time college undergraduate
 - Must be (or have a parent who is) currently or formerly employed in an Asian-owned or Asian cuisine restaurant
 - Must participate in community advocacy and social justice work on behalf of APIDA, immigrant, LGBTQ+, and/or other progressive causes
 - Must have a 3.0 GPA or higher
 - Must demonstrate financial need
- The <u>Health Care Communicators Scholarship</u> is a \$2,000 scholarship for students who are entering the healthcare field. Qualified applicants must be high school seniors or college students presently enrolled, and in good standing in a San Diego County, Orange County, or Los Angeles County school. <u>Apply by April 1</u>.
- The Matt Fong Asian Americans in Public Finance Scholarship is a \$2,500 scholarship for students who are majoring in accounting, political science, public policy, business administration, economics or related fields. Two winners are selected annually. Apply by April 8.
- The <u>Beverley Yip Scholarship</u> is a \$2,500 scholarship for students who are
 pursuing post-secondary education toward a degree in social work, behavioral
 health, or related fields in health and human services. Two winners are
 selected annually. <u>Apply by April 15</u>.
