APIDA Center learns about Indian Jute Crafts!

On Monday, April 11, we hosted a special <u>Crafty Monday</u> workshop: Dr. <u>Amsamani</u> <u>Sundarvel</u> zoomed in from India to teach us about <u>Indian jute crafts</u>. This was our first international event! Dr. Sundarvel is a Professor in the Department of Textiles and Clothing at the <u>Avinashilingam Institute</u> for Home Science and Higher Education for Women. In addition to teaching us about jute, Dr. Sundarvel also taught us how to make a decorative jute craft. Here are some fun facts about jute:

- Jute is a vegetable fiber. It is the name of the plant or fiber that is used to make burlap or gunny cloth. It is the most environment-friendly fiber.
- Jute is easily grown in tropical countries like Bangladesh and India. Over 90% of the world's jute is harvested in these two countries.
- Jute and cotton are the top two most versatile vegetable fibers. Jute is used to make cloths, bags, rugs, ropes, tents, and much more.


APIDA Flex Alerts!
