


Director's Message from Dr. Loh-Hagan

APIDA Center remembers the fight for Ethnic Studies!

This March, we remember the historic BIPOC student strikes in the Bay Area that established Ethnic Studies nationwide. In 1968, the United States faced national political unrest. The Black Student Union at San Francisco State University (CSU) advocated for a Black Studies department which was rejected by the administration for three years. In 1968, they formed a multiracial coalition with the Latin American Students Organization, the Filipino American Collegiate Endeavor, the Asian American Political Alliance, El Renacimiento, and others. This became known as the Third World Liberation Front (TWLF). (During the early 1960's, empowered APIDA students collectively used "Asian American" as a political strategy. This created unity among APIDA people to advocate for Asian American rights.)

BIPOC students wanted their own spaces to learn about their heritages, traditions, and histories. From November 6, 1968 to March 20, 1969, these student activists engaged in five months of strikes. On March 20, 1969, a deal was struck resulting in more diverse admission processes and the development of the first College of Ethnic Studies in the nation. That stated, not all of their demands were met; the fight for inclusive, equitable, and meaningful education for all continues today.

In 1970, inspired by the TWLF, San Diego State University established the first Women's Studies Department in the nation. On August 17, 2020, AB 1460 was signed into law; this bill requires all students at the California State Universities to take three units in Ethnic Studies in order to graduate. Today we celebrate the student activism that led to the creation of Ethnic Studies departments. The APIDA Center, through our programming, uplifts our APIDA histories and narratives; in addition, we proudly and actively support the ongoing establishment of Asian American Studies at SDSU.

In collaboration with SDSU Well-Being and Health Promotion, the APIDA Center hosted two-workshops on March 13th and March 20th.
