APIDA Center learns about APIDA support for The Huntington!

On February 16th, the APIDA Center and Office of Housing Administration are hosting a <u>field trip</u> to The Huntington (<u>apply to reserve your spot</u>)! Located in San Marino, The Huntington library, art museum, and botanical gardens is a SoCal hot spot and super Instagrammable!

The city of San Marino consists of APIDA populations with strong Taiwanese and Chinese communities. Many of these APIDA residents have played a significant role in the restoration and expansion of The Huntington.

In 1997, Mark H.L. Chen and Chun-Mei Chen rallied support from the Chinese Club of San Marino to fund the development of The Huntington Chinese Garden. In 2004, June Li became its founder and curator. In 2014, June and Simon Li provided a \$3 million endowment to fund the East Asian Garden Studies Center and Chinese Gardener curator position. They recently donated a \$2 million gift for the creation of the Star Gazing Tower.

Matthew Lin, the first Chinese American mayor and City Council member of San Marino (2001-09), and his wife, Joy Lin, contributed \$3 million for the Flowery Brush Studio which houses Chinese art, calligraphy and furniture.

The See family and Leong family are two of the earliest recorded Chinese families in Los Angeles. In 2020, the Pacific Rim collection received the Gilbert, Florence, and Leslee See Leong Collection which is an archive of early Chinese American immigrant families. In 2021, Lisa See donated more than 200 rare glass plate negatives and photographs taken in Old Chinatown during the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

In 1911, The Huntington established the Japanese Garden; later, a bonsai court and ceremonial teahouse were added. Toshie and Frank Mosher have helped sustain this through the generous Mosher Japanese Garden Curatorial Endowment. Toshie, a survivor of the bombing of Hiroshima in Japan, named a rose "Peace and Harmony" which represents the importance of unity that she believed was needed to combat racial injustice.

Yohko and Akira Yokoi donated their 320-year old ancestral Japanese home, which serves as an embodiment of Japanese architecture, agriculture, and sustainability. Over \$11 million was donated to support the relocation and reconstruction of this historical structure. Additionally, the Wongs funded golf carts to ease travel between the Chinese and Japanese gardens.

It is important to recognize and build an APIDA community of giving. We rely on donors to preserve our histories and uplift our communities. Give what you can, when you can!


APIDA Flex Alerts!
