

Know APIDA History!



APIDA Center learns about Assembly Bill (AB) No. 1354!

This January 2024 marks the beginning of significant changes to California K-12 education. AB 1354 calls for the inclusion of APIDA history in K-12 curriculum. The legislature encourages the teaching of the Armenian, Cambodian, Darfur, and Rwandan genocides to give context to civil rights and human right violations. Additionally, the legislature calls for the instruction of the WWII Japanese Incarceration, Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, Chinese-American contributions to the development of the Transcontinental Railroad, and more. In learning about the history of oppression as well as APIDA joy and resistance, students will gain a more accurate, complete, and inclusive overview of U.S. history.

AB No. 1354 initially passed in the California Assembly on May 4, 2023 and the Senate on August 17, 2023. On September 1, 2023, the bill was officially signed into law by Governor Gavin Newsom. This new legislature will strengthen diversity in statewide curriculum and help combat the violence directed at APIDA communities that has intensified during the COVID-19 pandemic. Initially, AB No. 1354 was introduced by Assembly Member Mike Fong. Presently, Fong serves as the Chair of the Assembly Higher Education Committee and the Assembly Vice Chair of the Asian American and Pacific Islander Legislative Caucus. It was supported by major national APIDA networks such as Stop API Hate and Asian Pacific Islander American Affairs Public Affairs (APAPA).

Over 15% of California's population identifies as APIDA. California possesses the second highest percentage of Asian Americans in the country. Given that APIDAs are the fastest growing ethnic group in the state, education on APIDA histories and narratives is long past due.

Dr. Loh-Hagan, a former K-8 teacher and teacher educator, has been working on these efforts for years. As such, the APIDA Center will be working in collaboration with <u>The Asian American Education Project</u> to support the model curricula for Hmong American, Cambodian American, and Vietnamese American experiences.
